



## Certified Nurse Aide (CNA)

*Certified Nursing Aides (CNAs) play an important role in healthcare delivery. They provide routine patient care under the direct supervision of a nurse. CNAs collect and report vital patient information including temperatures, pulses, and blood pressures and assist with daily activities such as bathing, walking, and feeding.*

Learn the proper way to perform nursing procedures essential to meeting the needs of patients under your care. The Certified Nurse Aide training program consists of lectures, skills development and clinical training. This program is approved by the State Department of Public Health. Both classroom and clinical training are included in the course and must be successfully completed to sit for the state exam. The course textbook, State of Connecticut Certification exam fee and State of Connecticut Nurse Aide Registry application fee are included in the course.

A suitability interview is required to discuss your professional goals and your reasons for pursuing a career as a Certified Nurse Aide (CNA).

**Note:** Persons with criminal convictions may be denied access to clinical training sites and may have difficulty finding employment in the healthcare industry.
