



Phlebotomy Technician

Do you enjoy working with people and work well under pressure? A career as a phlebotomy technician may be right for you. Phlebotomy Technicians are valuable members of the healthcare team who collect and prepare lab specimens for analysis.

In this 120-hour course, students will learn about phlebotomy procedures and practice blood draw techniques. Topics will include—but are not limited to—medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, venipuncture, specimen collection procedures, safety and universal precautions, common laboratory tests with clinical significance to body systems and disease processes, and laboratory equipment. Students will complete an internship at Middlesex Hospital Outpatient Laboratory. Students must have transportation to clinical sites.

Upon completion of this program, students must successfully complete the Registered Phlebotomy Technician certification exam offered through the American Medical Technologists (AMT) to gain employment as a Certified Phlebotomist/Phlebotomy Technician. A suitability interview is required to discuss your professional goals and your reasons for pursuing a career as a Phlebotomy Technician.
