



Patient Care Technician (PCT)

As the elderly population increases, healthcare facilities, hospitals and nursing homes have a great demand for qualified Patient Care Technicians (PCTs). PCTs provide hands-on assistance to serve patients' basic needs and work alongside other healthcare professionals.

The PCT certificate program is an exciting opportunity for CNAs to advance their skills, earn a better salary and have more job options in a changing work environment. They may work in hospitals, rehabilitation settings, physician offices, clinics, and long-term care facilities.

Upon completion of this training program, students are eligible to take the National Health Career Association Certified Patient Care Technician exam—which is needed to gain employment as a PCT. The CPCT exam fee will be covered by HCAP.

A suitability interview is required to discuss your professional goals and your reasons for pursuing a career as a Patient Care Technician (PCT).

Note: Persons with criminal convictions may be denied access to clinical training sites and may have difficulty finding employment in the healthcare industry.
