The CTWorks Disability Program Navigator is a central point of contact and information for employers and employees with workplace needs. The Navigator is an excellent resource on virtually any program that is designed to help people with disabilities to enter and remain in the workplace.

Since ADA became law, employers have shown a willingness to comply not just with the letter of the law, but with the spirit of the law. In part this is because employers are recognizing the untapped potential that this new set of workers, many with skills and capabilities much-sought-after in the labor market, is contributing to the state economy.

The CTWorks Disability Program Navigator is a “change agent” training Career Center employees about working with jobseekers with disabilities. CTWorks Career Centers offer free job training, skill-building and job placement services, all of which are open and accessible to jobseekers with disabilities.
